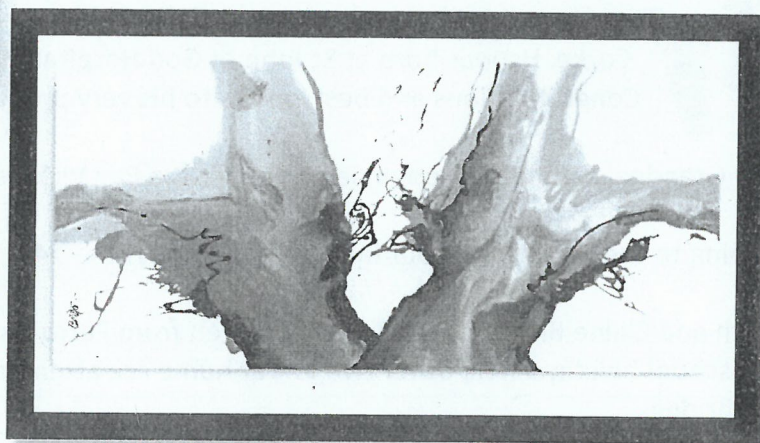

CELEBRATING Coralie was always going to be easy. People were guaranteed to travel from afar and Coralie was always going to shine in the spotlight. And that is exactly what happened.

On Saturday September 15th the Ravensthorpe community paid tribute to an incredibly respected and loved teacher of 40 years. Past colleagues, students and friends travelled from across the state to be there on Saturday to pay their respects to their revered friend and teacher. It was a carnival atmosphere that Coralie carried off in true style and humility.

Coralie waving from a beautifully decorated "blossoms and possums" open wagon behind Clydesdale horses down the main street of Ravensthorpe in the annual street parade, was a great way to kick off the festivities. Followers of the street parade then took the opportunity to nostalgically wander through the school. The school administrators and student leaders had generously opened the school to welcome visitors through the classrooms and across the grounds.

Coinciding with the annual country carnival encouraged the visitors to browse our wonderfully talented locals at their stalls and to be constantly entertained. Classmate and teacher reunions were enthusiastically embraced and there's no show without punch as Coralie enjoyed the opportunity to re-connect with old friends.

Early in the evening, young and old gathered upstairs in the entertainment centre completely filling the room. They enjoyed lively chatter and browsed the static and electronic display of teachers and students from 1978 – 2018. Comments such as "oh, look at that hairstyle back then", and, "can you believe we wore such daggy clothes" were very common.

Speakers during the evening spoke of Coralie's teaching and leadership expertise. Her ability to reach beyond the outer image, look into the children's hearts, and the ability to understand and respect what she sees. An inspirational leader capturing hearts and minds. The inner need to strive for what is true and right. A woman who really knows how to have a lot of fun with her colleagues and students. An energetic contributor to our community. A unique teacher who has taught three generations of the same family.

Coralie responded with some fun anecdotes of how times have changed over 40 years. From gestetners to laptops, creating worksheets to copying them and being told not to worry about attending superannuation meetings because she was a woman!

She shared her passion for her craft, and was an influencer in education through her first steps literacy initiatives. Coralie finished her speech with "When I think of all my blossoms and possums my heart swells with pride. I feel incredibly privileged to be able to teach the kids of our community. The past and present students are the best kids in the galaxy. We are so blessed to have them".

Gifts, flowers and the cutting of a Theresa Francis cake closed the speeches, with a celebratory rendition of "For she's a jolly good fellow". It was the standing ovation that signalled the true finale to a very worthy and wonderful, Coralie Daw

On Saturday 22 September 2018 the fitting memorial was unveiled on Ashton currently owned by Ken & Shelley Mutton.

Fran Sussex and Beth Edwards granddaughters of Robert and Sarah Snow instigated and worked towards the completion of the project.

Their families, together with John Brown and Ken and Shelley have all done their bit. The selecting of an appropriate rock was the hardest part with many hours spent searching before selecting one not far from the site.

A plaque with the names and dates was ordered and Ken has built a sturdy fence incorporating the front gate from Bulman's old house not far away. The finished effect is really brilliant especially since it had a green crop for a background on the day.

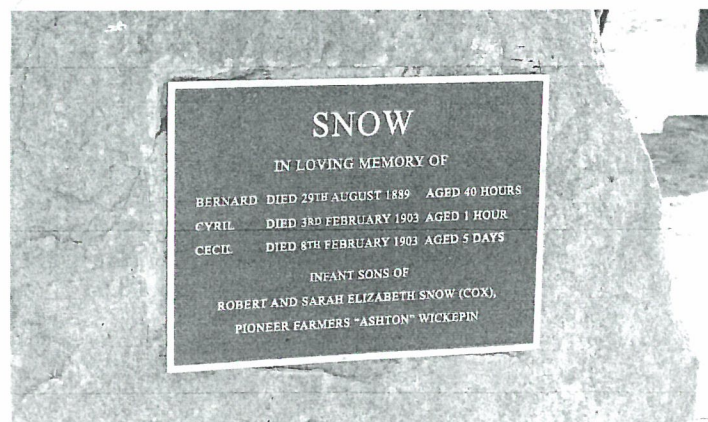

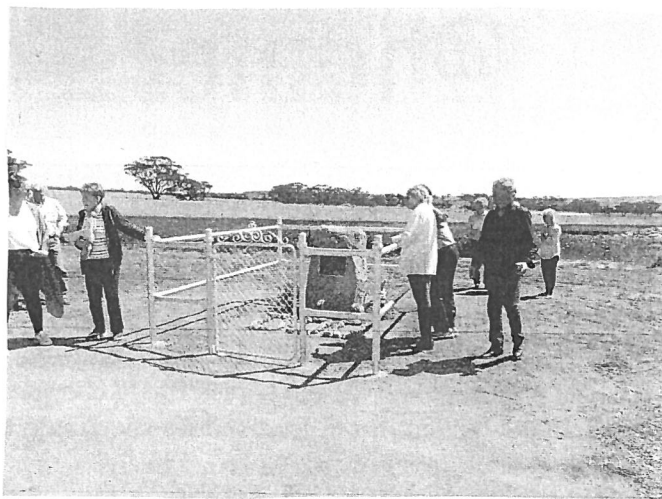

Lemon and honey chicken salad

Ingredients:

Zest and juice of 1 lemon, (plus 1 tablespoon lemon juice, extra)

2 tablespoons honey

1/4 cup (60ml) extra virgin olive oil

1 cup mint leaves, half the leaves finely chopped

4 x 200g chicken breast fillets, each sliced into thirds

200g podded fresh or frozen broad beans

1/2 (200g) garlic ciabatta loaf halved lengthways,
torn into small pieces

Large handful baby spinach

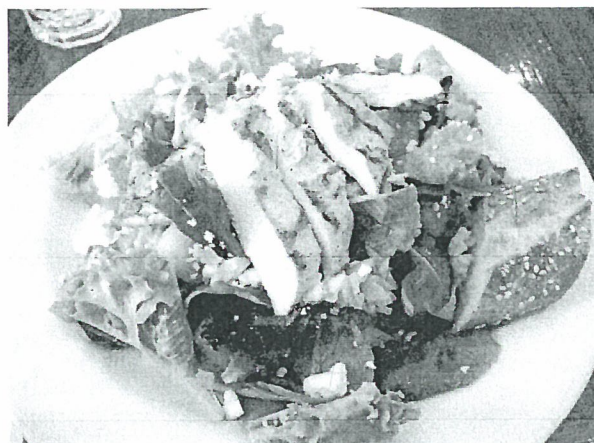
400g can chickpeas, rinsed & drained

125g cherry tomatoes, halved

1/2 cucumber, finely chopped

1/4 cup flat-leaf parsley leaves, chopped

2 teaspoons wholegrain mustard



Method:

Preheat grill to medium-high.

Combine lemon zest and juice, honey, 1 1/2 tablespoons oil and chopped mint in a large bowl. Season with sea salt and freshly ground black pepper. Add chicken, stir to coat, then place in the refrigerator for 10 minutes to marinate.

Meanwhile, blanch broad beans in boiling water for 1-2 minutes. Drain and refresh under cold running water. Remove tough outer skins. Set aside. Place ciabatta on a baking tray and grill for 4-5 minutes until golden and crisp.

Preheat a chargrill pan to high. Cook chicken for 2-3 minutes each side until caramelised and cooked through. Toss broad beans, ciabatta, spinach, chickpeas, tomatoes, cucumber, parsley and whole mint leaves in a large bowl.

Whisk together mustard and remaining 2 tablespoons oil and 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Season.

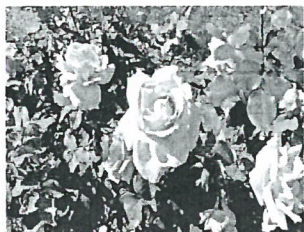
Divide the salad among plates, pour over dressing and top with chicken to serve.

Plant all the spring vegies now: lettuce, capsicum, tomatoes, cucumber, spinach, silverbeet, and others that are available in the nurseries as the weather is warming up.

Also plant your favourite herbs.

Apply a lupin, pea or a soft mulch around vegie beds, pots and herb gardens, about 30mm thick. Apply a seaweed solution to all garden beds to help the soil absorb moisture and provide microbes with food. Continue to weed!!!



Watch out for the aphids

particularly on roses and hibiscus.

Squash them, squirt them or spray them

with a soapy homemade spray or use

a commercial product specifically for aphid control

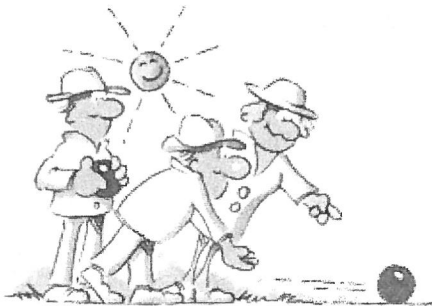
Opening day for the 2018/19 season had 25 members turn up for an enjoyable afternoon of bowls.

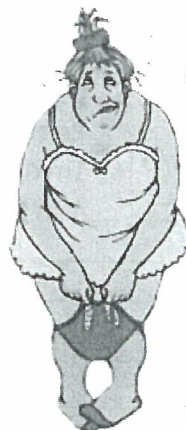

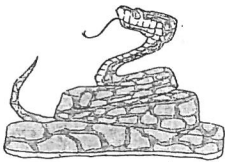

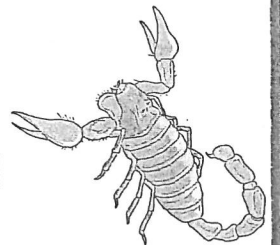
