# IN FLANDERS FIELDS



#### **EASY CROCHETED POPPY**

#### Gather your supplies

1 ball 8ply yarn in red; scraps of 8ply yarn in green and black; novelty yarn in black.3.50mm crochet hook; wool needle for sewing in yarn ends.

*Note:* Tension is tighter than normally recommended.

#### Here's how Petals

Using 3.50mm hook and red yarn, make a magic ring.

**1st round:** 3ch, 9tr into ring. Pull the slip ring tight to close centre of ring, sl st in 3rd ch at beg to join.

**2nd round:** 3ch, 1tr in first st, 2tr in each st to last st, sl st in 3rd ch at beg to join.

**3rd round:** 3ch, 2tr in first st, 3tr in each st to

last st, sl st in 3rd ch at beg to join.

4th round: 3 ch, 1tr in first st, 2tr in each st to

last st, sl st in 3rd ch at beg to join.

Fasten off. Sew in ends.

#### Centre

Using 3.50hook and green yarn, make a magic ring.

**1st round:** 3ch, 9tr into ring. Pull the slip rin tight to close centre of ring, sl st in 3rd ch at beg to join.

Fasten off. Sew in ends.

Join black yarn with a sl st into edge of circle on right side. 1ch \*1dc into first st, 1ch.
Repeat from \* to end of round. Sl st to join.
Fasten off leaving a long tail. Sew in ends.

#### To make up

Using wool needle and black tail, attach centre to petals invisibly. Decorate with novelty yarn if desired.

#### **EASY KNITTED POPPY**

#### Gather your supplies

1 ball 8ply yarn in red: scraps of 8ply yarn in green and black; 3.50mm knitting needles; wool needle for sewing in yarn ends.

*Note:* Tension is tighter than normally recommended to maximise the curl in the petals.

#### Here's how

#### **Petals**

Using 3.50mm needles and redyarn, cost on 120 stitches.

**1st - 4th rows:** Work in garter stitch (every row knit).

**5th row:** \*Slip1, knit 2 together; pass slip stitched over, repeat from \* to end ... 40 stitches.

6th - 9th rows: Knit

10th row: Knit 2 together across the row ... 20

stitches

11th - 14th rows: Knit

**15th row**: Knit 2 together across the row ... 10 stitches. Cut yarn leaving a 15cm tail. Thread wood needle with tail, insert through remaining stitches and pull up tightly to form a circle. Join sides using mattress stitch.

#### Centre

Using 3.50mm needles and green yarn, cast on 8 stitches.

1st row: Knit 2nd row: Purl

Repeat 1st and 2nd rows until work is square (8 - 10 rows). Cut yarn leaving a 15cm tail. Thread wool needle with tail, slip through remaining stitches and pull tight noting purl side is front of work. Using running stitch around edge of square, ease into a circle and tuck under.

#### To make up

Stitch the poppy centre, tucked-side down, to the body of the poppy using black yarn. Sew in ends.

'Fallen but not Forgotten' a comprehensive history of the soldiers from our district, will also be launched during the service. A shared lunch will follow inside the Wickepin Town Hall at the conclusion of the service.



#### **DOG OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES**

In light of a recent dog attack to a ram on a property adjoining the Wickepin townsite, dog owners are reminded of their responsibilities in owning dogs:

- ALL dogs MUST be registered with the Shire of Wickepin.
- A maximum of 2 dogs per household.
- Dogs MUST not be allowed to wander.
- When in public dogs MUST be leashed and/or muzzled.
- When in a 'leash free area' dogs MUST still be in control/supervision by their owner.

ALL dogs must by now be registered with the Shire of Wickepin. The shire's Ranger has been ordered to collect all unregistered dogs and impound them, releasable upon payment of ALL fees applicable. Failure of owner's responsibilities WILL result in fines being issued.

#### HARVEST MASS MANAGEMENT SCHEME



#### Changes to the Scheme

. Changes have been made to continue allowing 'First and last' mile access on roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) Network access. The changes ensure there are no adverse effects on road safety and Main Roads legal obligations are met



- · If you wish to participate in HMMS, continue to register your vehicles with a participating Grain Receiver.
- · If RAV access is required on roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network access under HMMS, you must apply to Main Roads by submitting a HMMS Road List form to advise us of the RAV combination & roads being used.
- · Your HMMS Road List must be endorsed by Main Roads before starting HMMS operations on these roads. Apply now to avoid delays.



#### **Processing Your Application**

- · Main Roads will check the nominated roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network access to ensure they are safe for the proposed RAV combination.
- . If deemed safe, your HMMS Road List will be endorsed and any additional access conditions specified (if necessary)

# Harvest Mass Management Scheme

What you need to know for 2018-2019 Harvest Period



- . The Main Roads endorsed HMMS Road List must be carried in the RAV
- . The most direct route must be used between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network
- The RAV combination being used must not be a higher RAV category than the nearest RAV Network
- When travelling on the roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network access. the maximum speed is 40 km/h and you must display an amber flashing warning light.



- . Main Roads will use the HMMS Road Lists to prioritise onsite route assessments, with the aim of adding the roads to the relevant RAV Network.
- . This will eliminate the need to continue providing the HMMS Road List in future



- . Use a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination that is 20 m or less in length and 50 t or less in gross mass.
- · Use a RAV that is greater than a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination on approved RAV Network roads.
- . Apply to have my road (s) added to the RAV Network through the standard process.

#### Twice-cooked pork spare ribs



#### Ingredients

- 8 (about 800g) Coles Australian Pork Spare Ribs
- 40g pkt McCormick Grill Mates (American BBQ Slow Low Tennessee Smokehouse BBQ) barbecue spice rub
- 375ml apple cider or apple juice
- 200ml pineapple juice
- 200ml McCormick Grill Mates Vintage Smokehouse BBO Sauce
- 1/3 cup (100g) whole-egg mayonnaise

- 1/3 cup (95g) Greek-style yoghurt
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 250g brussels sprouts, very thinly sliced
- 400g Coleslaw Supreme Mix
- 3 spring onions, thinly sliced
- 1/2 bunch flat-leaf parsley, chopped

#### Method

Preheat oven to 140C. Place the ribs in a single layer in a roasting pan and coat with Grill Mates barbecue rub. Add the cider or apple juice, adding a little extra water if necessary to just cover the ribs. Cover the surface with baking paper, then cover the pan with foil. Bake for 2 hours or until tender. Drain ribs and set aside to cool. Place in a single layer on a baking tray in the fridge for 1 hour to chill.

Meanwhile, heat the pineapple juice in a small saucepan over medium heat for 5 mins or until the liquid reduces by half. Remove from heat and stir in the Grill Mates barbecue sauce.

Combine the mayonnaise, yoghurt, oil and lemon juice in a large bowl. Add the brussels sprouts, coleslaw mix, spring onion and parsley. Toss to coat. Season.

Heat a barbecue grill or char-grill on medium-high. Cook ribs on grill, brushing with barbecue glaze, for 6-7 mins or until evenly coated and caramelised. Serve with the slaw.



#### Apple and blueberry tarts

A biscuit crumb base and double-fruit filling gives this darling sweet pie a creative twist.

#### Ingredients

- 250g Granita biscuits
- 125g butter, melted, cooled
- 3/4 cup sour cream

- legg
- 2 tablespoons icing sugar
- 1 Golden Delicious apple 1/3 cup frozen blueberries

#### Method

Place biscuits into a food processor and process to fine crumbs. Transfer to a bowl. Add butter and stir until well combined.

Spoon mixture (reserving 2 tablespoons for topping), into 4 fluted, 11cm x 2cm-deep, loose-bottom tart pans. Press crumb mixture into base and sides of pans. Place in fridge for 20 minutes.

Place sour cream, egg and icing sugar into a small bowl. Whisk until well combined. Spoon into prepared pans. Cut apple into quarters, remove core and slice thinly. Arrange apple slices and blueberries over custard mixture. Sprinkle with reserved crumb mixture. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until custard is set. Serve warm.






#### ADULT DVD






