Barry was born in 1955 at St Anne's Hospital in Mount Lawley to Doug and Mulvie Corke, and returned to the farm at Yealering where his older sister Janie looked forward to his arrival.

He, with his sisters Janie and Alison and brothers, Lindsay and Alan went to the Yealering School then to High School in Narrogin.

Weekends were busy and never long enough. Football matches in winter, tennis in summer, when all the kids got together while parents were otherwise occupied.

After the winter rains the creek below the house filled and became a special playground. A chance to try out homemade canoes, catch tadpoles and spend happy hours along the banks.

School days over, Barry came happily home to the farm where he worked with Doug and for a few years with his beloved Grandad Harold. They spent many happy hours in the old ute, bumping over the paddocks of Rolvenden.

He loved the animals and they responded to his care and affection.

Great fun was had when bat and ball and wooden box appeared for a game of backyard cricket with Harold, a keen player, trying to control the lot and settle disputes. They were sometimes joined by cousins Harold, Brian and Ross Poultney. Harold kept a bat and ball in his office, and didn't take much persuading when a game was suggested.

Yealering Lake was a great playground too and in the later years Barry canoed over its water and swamps capturing the graceful black swans and other wildlife on film.

School holidays were spent mainly at Cottesloe- happy times at the beach and river where Doug taught Barry to swim. He was a reluctant starter but that changed when he took to scuba diving and developed a passion for the sea. That combined with photography, opened up a whole new world.

His subjects were many and varied- the ocean, world of whales, happy occasions such as weddings, parties, school balls, sporting events and rodeos. Then the more sedate carriage driving and military displays, each receiving his undivided attention.

Barry chose to live alone and sadly died alone. But part of him will live forever in the wide blue ocean, carefree summer days, changing seasons on the farm and in a long yarn over a cup of tea and a favourite Anzac biscuit.

Veggie and ham mini quiches with homemade shortcrust pastry

Pastry

200 grams plain flour 100 grams cubed butter 60 mls cold water 2 eggs

1 grated zucchini

1 grated carrot

2 slices of ham, cut into slivers

1 tablespoon milk

3/4 cup grated cheese



Method

Preheat oven to 180 degrees

Pastry

Add the butter and flour to the bowl of a food processor and process until it looks like bread crumbs.

Pour the water gently into the top, watching until a pastry forms. You may not need all of the water.

Roll out the pastry until .5mm thick.

Cut the shapes required for your quiche/ flan tins.

Push the pastry into your tins, blind bake (this means weighted with a piece of baking paper then either uncooked rice, dried beans or actual baking weights) for 15 minutes.

Allow to cool for 5 minutes before filling.

Filling

Mix the eggs, milk, ham and veggies together until well mixed. Fill the cooled bases with the mixture, then top with cheese. Cook for 15 minutes or until set.



Ingredients

300 grams chicken mince

1 cup grated parmesan

8 basil leaves

1 tablespoon olive oil

Method

Preheat oven to 180 degrees.

Place the mince, basil, parmesan and olive oil into a food processor.

Blitz until well combined.

With wet hands, roll a teaspoonful into balls and place in a mini muffin tray.

Bake for 35 minutes at 180 degrees.



Broccoli and Cheese mini muffins

Ingredients

1 cup milk

1 cup SR flour

1 cup wholemeal SR flour

1 and 1/4 cups cooked, smashed broccoli

1 cup grated cheddar

1 and 1/2 teaspoons dried thyme


1 egg
