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
LETTER FROM THE EDITOR



MAINTENANCE WORKS

GRANTS AGED HOUSING

Council appointed Tammy King, Principal Grants Consultant of Grants Empire to prepare the Business Case for the Wheatbelt South Aged Housing Alliance and submit the grant application to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

The Aged Housing Project will deliver 14 (2-bed, 1-bath) in-situ independent living units across four local governments in the Wheatbelt South region in 2019/20. The \$5,098,300 project will facilitate ageing in place for the growing number of older people in the region and provide an alternative to prematurely entering residential aged care facilities both regionally and in the metropolitan area.

The Project will incorporate the principles of universal and dementia enabling design to promote functional and social independence, allowing people aged over 65 years (and Aboriginal people aged over 55 years) requiring additional support to remain in their community as long as possible.

All independent living units built as part of the Project will also conform with all relevant building codes and guidelines.

The grant application was forwarded to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development on the 14th December 2019 and Council is awaiting a response in relation to this grant application. The Shire of Wickepin has requested a meeting with the Honourable Alannah MacTiernan MLC, Minister for Regional Development; Agriculture and Food; Minister assisting the Minister for State Development, Jobs and Trade to discuss the application.

CONSULTANTS FOR AGRICULTURAL FEASIBILITY

The Shire of Wickepin has advertised for consultants to attract and promote Agricultural based Industries and Businesses to the Shire of Wickepin.

The main objectives and aims of the consultants are to assess opportunities for the development and expansion of new and existing agricultural industries, activities and events within the Shire of Wickepin to establish the Shire as a hub for agricultural research, extension and education.

It is anticipated that the successful consultants will be appointed by the end of May 2019 to start this exciting process.

BUDGET PRODUCTION

The process for the 2019/2020 budget are underway so if you wish Council to consider any project or require any specific grants please put in your submission to the CEO by the end of June 2019.

DOG LICENCING

All dogs must be registered with the Shire of Wickepin. The Shire's Ranger has been ordered to collect all unregistered dogs and impound them, releasable upon payment of all fees applicable. Failure of owner's responsibilities will result in fines being issued. All dogs must be registered with the Shire of Wickepin.

PROPOSED WOGOLIN PARK UPDATE

Feedback from the community on how they would like to see the recreational space around the Albert Facey Homestead developed has been passed onto the Landscape Architect working on a concept plan for the park.

Wish items identified include a flying fox, pump track and/or skate park, tall climbing tower with slides of different heights, net swings, nature play spaces and a community garden. A feature survey of the site has been created. A draft concept plan will be ready by the end of April and will be brought to the public for comment.

Shire will have to source grants to fund the park. Community groups and individuals will be asked to be involved in this process. A collective investment and belief will enable the project to move forwards and become a reality. BUILDING SUSTAINABLE CLUBS

Wickepin has partnered with Narrogin in the Building Sustainable Clubs Program. The Program's purpose is to support and enhance the sustainability, capacity and capability of our clubs in the Upper Great Southern region through a range of strategies. As part of this program Caroline Robinson from the Wheatbelt Business Network will facilitate a workshop in Wickepin – tentatively set for May 7 at 1pm. This will be a short and sweet workshop concentrating on:

- Succession planning
- Member recruitment – especially younger people
- Meeting procedures
- Forward planning

It will be an informal mix & match session with lots of resources, tips, templates and tangible items that groups can take home, including intellectual information. This workshop is not limited to sport clubs as all community groups will benefit from the information. There will be an opportunity to do Q & A around constitutions - Caroline is happy for people to bring their constitutions along to check that everything is in order.
