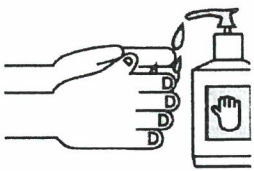

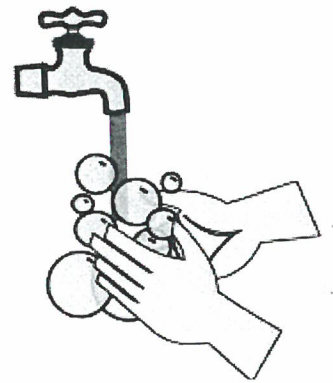

2020/21 RATES

Shire of Wickepin rates will be issued following the August ordinary meeting of council. To ensure you receive your rates notice and to alleviate possible interest charges on late payments, please make sure we have your correct postal address on record and advise if any changes of ownership are required.

PENSIONER REBATE

If you hold one of the following cards, are a property owner, and were living at that property as your "ordinary place of residence" as at July 1 of the rating year, you may be eligible for a State Government rebate on your Rates and Emergency Services Levy.

- Pensioner Concession Card;
- WA State Seniors Card;
- Commonwealth Seniors Health Card and WA State Seniors Card; or
- State Concession Card

You may also be entitled to a rebate if you have life tenancy under the terms of a will. If you have already registered, the rebate will be shown on your notice as "State Government Rebate".

If you were previously registered for a Seniors Rebate and you now have a Pensioner Concession Card or Commonwealth Seniors Health Card, you should complete a new application to receive an increased rebate amount.

If you have purchased a new property and you had a rebate last year on the property that you sold, the rebate does not automatically transfer to your new property. You must complete a new application.

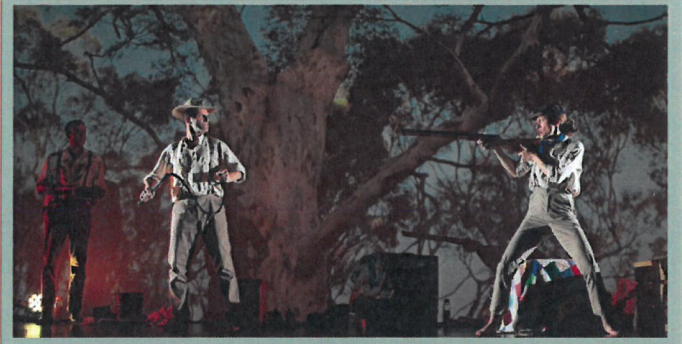

2020 Adult Pneumococcal Vaccination

**Free adult pneumococcal vaccinations are now available at the
Wickepin Health Centre for those over 70 years**

From July 1 2020, there are changes to the pneumococcal vaccination schedule under the National Immunisation Program.

Pneumococcal disease is more common in people aged over 70.

It is now recommended that all Australians aged 70 and over receive a free dose of the 13 valent pneumococcal vaccine (13vPCV).

To help support our local community members receive this important vaccine there will be adult vaccination clinics held at the Wickepin Health Service on:

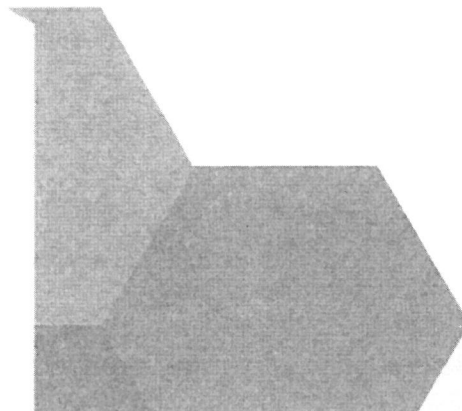

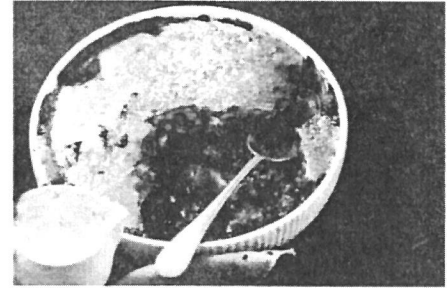

Winter Sweet Treats

Mixed apple & berry sponge pudding

INGREDIENTS

3 Granny Smith apples, peeled, chopped
2 tablespoons lemon juice, plus 2 teaspoons grated lemon zest
1 1/2 cups (330g) caster sugar
500g frozen mixed berries
2 eggs
1/2 cup (125ml) milk
2 tablespoons whisky
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 cup (150g) plain flour, sifted
1 teaspoon baking powder, sifted
Icing sugar, to dust
Thick cream mixed with 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon, to serve



METHOD

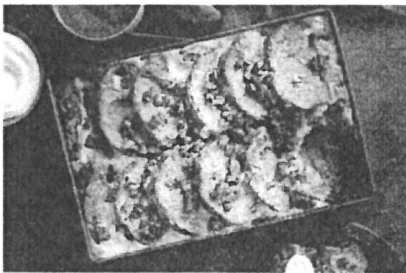
Preheat oven to 160C. Place the apple, juice and 1 cup (220g) sugar in a small pan and cook over low heat, stirring, for 3 minutes or until the sugar dissolves. Cook for a further 3-4 minutes, stirring occasionally, until apple softens slightly. Cool, then stir through berries. Transfer to a 1.25 litre baking dish. Set aside.

Whisk eggs, milk, whisky, lemon zest and vanilla in a bowl until combined. Set aside. Place flour, baking powder and remaining sugar in a bowl. Pour egg mixture into dry ingredients, whisking well to form a smooth batter. Pour over fruit, then bake for 30-35 minutes until golden and firm to the touch.

Dust with icing sugar and serve warm with cinnamon cream.

Sticky date banana bread and butter pudding



INGREDIENTS

1 cup pitted dried dates, chopped
3/4 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
550g packet banana bread, cut into 1cm-thick slices
4 eggs
1 cup milk

1 cup thickened cream
Icing sugar, for dusting
Caramel sauce, to serve
Double cream, to serve

METHOD

Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan-forced.

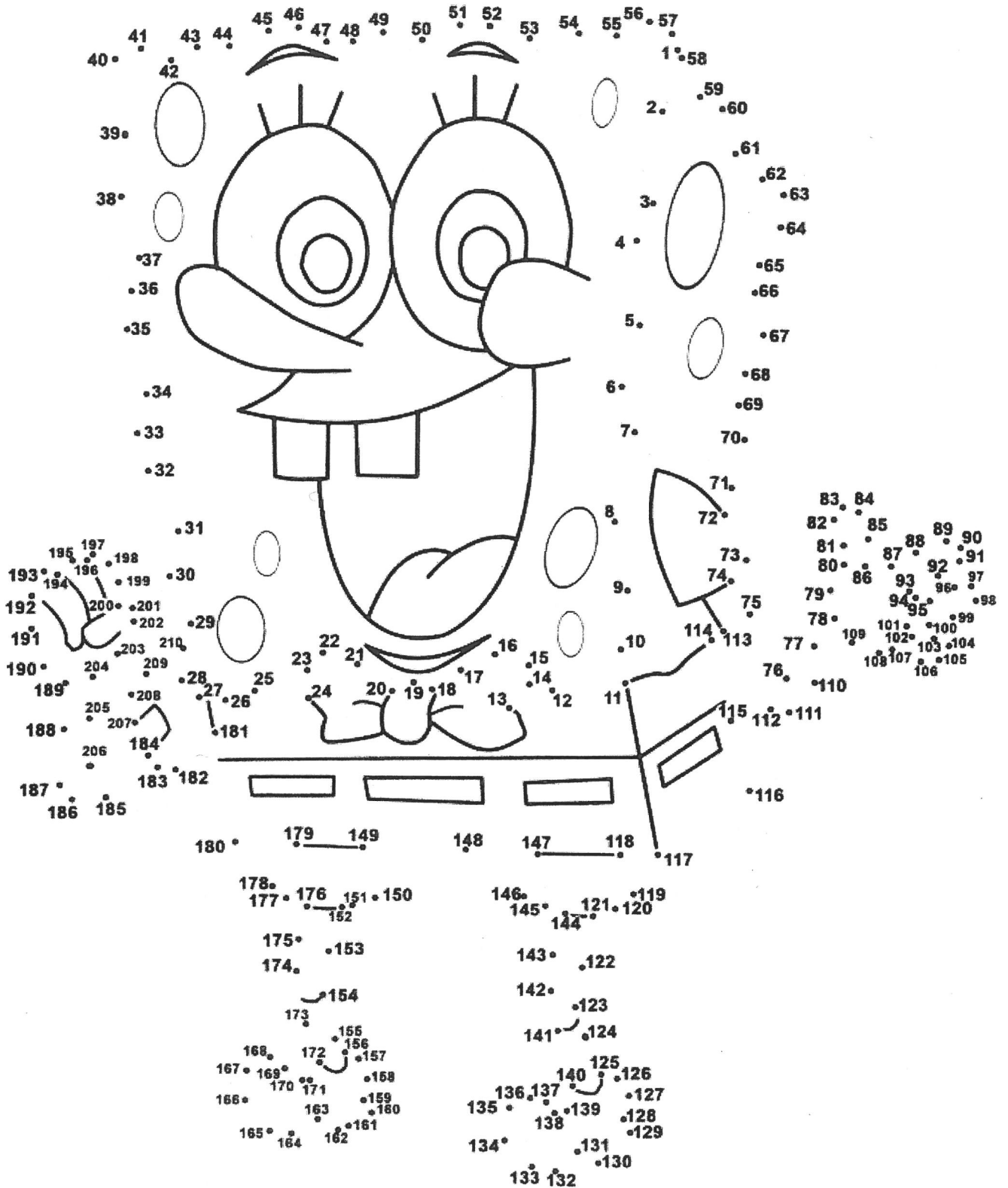
Place dates and 1 cup water in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Bring to the boil. Remove from heat. Stir in bicarbonate of soda. Set aside for 5 minutes.

Grease a 5cm-deep, 20cm x 30cm baking dish. Arrange banana bread slices, slightly overlapping, to cover base of dish. Whisk eggs, milk and cream in a bowl. Add date mixture. Whisk to combine. Pour egg mixture over banana bread (rearrange dates if all in a clump). Bake for 30 to 35 minutes or until golden and set.

Dust with icing sugar. Drizzle with caramel sauce and serve with double cream.
